RESEARCH AT OUC

Research at the Open University of Cyprus is wide-ranging and interdisciplinary. It includes both individual projects of its academic and research staff as well as collaborative efforts that involve local and international Universities, research centres and institutions. Based on its internationalisation strategy, OUC develops strong and effective partnerships with foreign research teams, which provide opportunities for international collaboration and active involvement in multidisciplinary projects, covering emerging developments in various fields:

- **arts, theatre, history and archaeology,**
- **literature and linguistics,**
- **commercial and European law,**
- **communication, journalism, social information systems,**
- **educational sciences, adult and continuous education, educational leadership,**
- **health sciences, health economics and applied statistics,**

- **environment, chemical engineering, ecology and climate change,**
- **information and communication technologies, artificial intelligence, cybersecurity, telecommunications.**

Research activities are financed by the University's state-funded budget, or receive external funding from various national, European and international programmes such as Horizon 2020, Erasmus+, LIFE+, and Interreg.

In addition to independent research, OUC six (6) research labs support collaborative research and engage faculty and students from across the University:

1. Chemical Engineering and Engineering Sustainability Lab
2. Computational Cognition Lab
3. Cybersecurity and Telecommunications Research Lab
4. Educational Technology Lab
5. Terrestrial Ecosystems Management Lab
6. Cyprus Center for Algorithmic Transparency

These dedicated research laboratories provide a vibrant research environment for OUC students, academics and researchers, as well as opportunities for the effective link between the University, businesses and the industry. The resulting synergies enable basic and applied research, and research outcomes for the benefit of society.

RESEARCH LABS

CHEMICAL ENGINEERING AND ENGINEERING SUSTAINABILITY LAB

The Laboratory combines new scientific areas of Sustainable Development, Environmental Management and Engineering, as well as Chemical Engineering, and is led by Associate Professor Antonis Zorpas. Its main research areas are the following:

- Cities Metabolism, Smart Cities, Strategic Development Plans, Sustainable Development Programmes, Circular Economy and Industrial Co-habitation Strategy.
- Waste Prevention practices and development of sustainability indicators (economic, social, environmental) and implementation of environmental management systems in various sectors.
- Environmental Impact Studies and Environmental Analysis / Risk Assessment / Multi-criteria and Life Cycle Analysis Models.
- Development of techniques - technologies for the treatment of solid and liquid waste, biosystems, hazardous waste, composting, etc.

COMPUTATIONAL COGNITION LAB

Research carried out at the Computational Cognition Lab (CCLab) seeks to understand cognitive processes often associated with individual or collective intelligence - such as learning, reasoning, sensing, communication, cooperation - and how these are employed by humans and other organisms in everyday life. Emphasis is placed on the development of formal computational models for various aspects of cognitive processes and the analysis of the formal implications that such models have. The CCLab is led by Associate Professor Loizos Michael.

CYBERSECURITY AND TELECOMMUNICATIONS RESEARCH LAB

The Cybersecurity and Telecommunications Research Lab (CTRL) has been established and is led by Professor Stavros Stavrou. CTRL's research activities are concentrating in the following areas: cybersecurity, protection of critical infrastructures, wireless communications and networks and localisation of wireless systems.

EDUCATIONAL TECHNOLOGY LAB

The OUC Laboratory for Educational Technology conducts research and publishing in the areas of open and distance learning methodologies, internet safety, mobile and adaptive learning, human-machine interaction and ICT utilization in school education.

TERRESTRIAL ECOSYSTEMS MANAGEMENT LAB

Work in the Terrestrial Ecosystems Management Lab (TemLab) is based on traditional approaches to ecosystem management coupled with landscape ecology principles, namely the importance of spatial configuration of ecological processes, and the emphasis on larger spatial extents. The TemLab is led by Professor Ioannis Vogiatzakis.

TemLab research revolves around three pillars that intertwine:

- a) Mediterranean Ecosystems with emphasis on islands and mountains
- b) Landscape based approach to conservation,
- c) Spatial Analysis for species and habitats modelling and ecosystem services.

CYPRUS CENTER FOR ALGORITHMIC TRANSPARENCY (CyCAT)

The Cyprus Center for Algorithmic Transparency, operating at OUC, aims to establish a network of researchers with key expertise in the areas of informatics and digital literacy. Among other broader impacts, CyCAT aims to create digital tools / databases that are relevant to the needs of Cypriot users and which will be used to raise awareness about algorithmic bias (in particular, biases found in information access systems that the public routinely uses), the creation of digital material related to the development of such systems, as well as the strengthening of actions and interventions in Cyprus on the importance of digital and algorithmic literacy.

CyCAT is led by Associate Professor Jahna Otterbacher and cooperates closely with the research group "fAlre - Fairness and Ethics in AI - Human Interaction" at the CYENS Centre of Excellence.

CYENS is the Research and Innovation Centre of Excellence in Cyprus focusing on Interactive media, Smart systems and Emerging technologies aiming to empower knowledge and technology transfer in the region.

CYENS aims to undertake world-class research in order to drive innovation across multiple industrial sectors creating social and economic benefit. In CYENS' approach this will move beyond research driven purely by technical challenges, and consider the central role of humans within technology development, deployment and adoption along with the societal challenges and impact of technology innovation.

CYENS is a joint venture of the Municipality of Nicosia and the three state universities of the Republic of Cyprus, i.e. Open University of Cyprus, University of Cyprus, Cyprus University of Technology, and two international partners (Max Planck Institute of Germany and University College London in the United Kingdom). Two OUC faculty member lead research groups at CYENS, Associate Professor Loizos Michael, head of OUC's Computational Cognition Lab, and Associate Professor Jahna Otterbacher, director of CyCAT.

Previous to joining the Open University of Cyprus in June 2018, Dr. Duval Hernandez worked at the Economics Research Centre at the University of Cyprus in the project "Employment in Europe (EUROEMP)", funded by the European Research Council, under the direction of Professor Christopher Pissarides.

He has also been an Assistant Professor in Economics at CIDE, Mexico, a Post-Doctoral Fellow at the Center for U.S.-Mexican Studies at UCSD, and a Visiting Assistant Professor at the University of Cyprus. In addition, Assistant Professor Duval Hernandez has been a consultant at The World Bank, as well as for research projects at the Inter-American Development Bank, the Mexican Government, and for the United Nations University World Institute for Development Economics Research, UNU-WIDER.

He currently is an IZA Research Fellow (Germany) and an External Affiliate at CIDE (Mexico).

The research of Dr. Duval Hernandez centers on the interrelationship between income mobility and the evolution of economic inequality, both from a theoretical and an empirical point of view. He has also studied labor supply decisions both in developing and developed countries. Additionally, he has studied to what extent the institutions and labor policies adopted in Europe are responsible for the higher levels of unemployment and the lower inequality observed relative to the United States. Finally, Prof. Duval Hernandez is currently studying segmentation in informal labor markets in developing countries using new data and econometric methods.

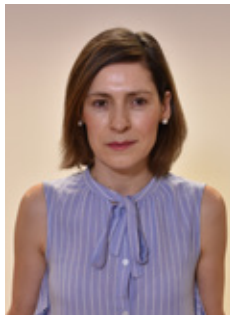

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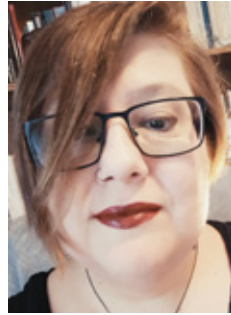

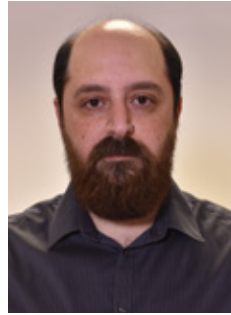

He served as the Academic Coordinator of the OUC Postgraduate Programme "Environmental Conservation and Management".

He is the editor of five (5) scientific books. He has more than 450 publications (including editor in books, contribution in books, papers in scientific journals and international conferences with an h-index=37). He is currently in the Editorial

In 2019 he received an honorary distinction for his long-standing contribution to the environmental issues of Cyprus from the President of the Republic. He is included in the 2% of the renowned scholars in his field for two consecutive years (2019, 2020) in the study "Updated science-wide author databases of standardized citation indicators, published by a research team of the Stanford University (USA), which includes the most influential researchers in the world.
